## ARCHITECTURAL SURVEY RESULTS

A review of GNAHRGIS did not reveal any previously identified historic resources in the vicinity of the project acrea. A review of historic aerial imagery spanning from the 1950s to the present was performed to ascertain the history of these structures. The Charlton County tax records were also consulted to ascertain a build date. A total of six structures were initially identified during the course of this investigation that appeared to be greater than 50 years in age, most of which were located near the southeastern portion of the project area across from SR 94. These structures include one TV antenna tower and four domestic buildings. Of these structures, only HS3 is considered eligible for NRHP inclusion. The locations of these structures can be found in Figures 23, while photographs of the current state of these structures can be found in Figures 24 through 28.

HS1 is a TV antenna tower with a non-historic metal building. A building appears in this location on the 1970 aerial, but given the low resolution of the photograph, it is unclear if this structure matches the current antenna tower. Tax records do not provide any information for this area. It is unlikely that any of the structures or buildings at this location are 50 years old and are ineligible for NRHP inclusion. An adjacent structure to HS1, HS2, was initially recorded; further investigation revealed HS2 to be a cell phone tower constructed in the early 2000s.
