

Second Annual Suwannee RIVERKEEPER® Songwriting Contest

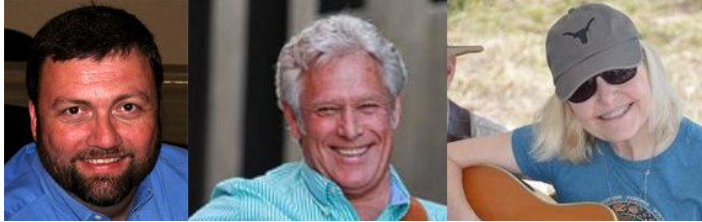

New: youth winners under 18 years old. Finalists and judges: mileage, 50 to 125 miles from venue.

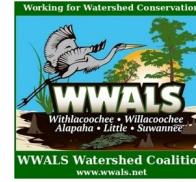
WWALS Watershed Coalition, Inc. (WWALS): is an IRS 501(c)(3) nonprofit charity.

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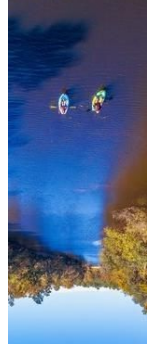

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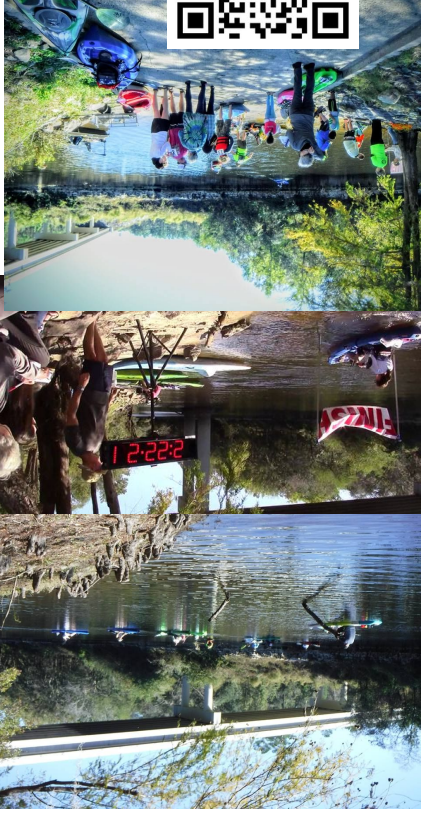
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
