

hospitals, schools, businesses, and homes along the way, as well as waterways and wells. WWALS has members near some of those existing or proposed LNG facilities, in Martin, Dade, and Citrus Counties, Florida. Several of those LNG export facilities have FE authorization to ship LNG to Free Trade Agreement and Non-Free-Trade-Agreement countries. WWALS objects to any gas through Sabal Trail being used for such private profit through export, which make a mockery of Sabal Trail's use of FERC-supplied federal eminent domain to take easements through private and public property for this pipeline. WWALS further objects to increasing the capacity of Sabal Trail through its Phase II construction so as to increase such LNG traffic through Florida or LNG export abroad.

For the reasons stated above, WWALS moves for FERC to halt Sabal Trail Phase II and to invoke penalties for lack of completion of the project.
