

## Spill Report Form GA EPD West Central District

Public Owned Treatment Works (POTWs) must complete the entire form, while all other facilities must complete only the shaded portions. Spills must be initially reported to EPD within 24 hours of discovery of the spill. A completed Spill Reporting Form must then be submitted to the EPD West Central District Office (WCD) within 5 days of the initial date of the spill. During regular business hours (M-F 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.) spill reporting is preferably accomplished by emailing to: [wcd.epdreporting@dnr.ga.gov](mailto:wcd.epdreporting@dnr.ga.gov). The WCD can also be contacted by phone at (478) 751-6612. To initially report a spill on a Weekend, State Holiday, or outside the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Weekdays, instead call the EPD Emergency Response Team (ERT) at (800)-241-4113.

**Rule 391-3-6-.03(3)(n)** "Water" or "waters of the State" means any and all rivers, streams, creeks, branches, lakes, reservoirs, ponds, drainage systems, springs, wells, wetlands, and all other bodies of surface or subsurface water, natural or artificial, lying within or forming a part of the boundaries of the State which are not entirely confined and retained completely upon the property of a single individual, partnership, or corporation.
