### County Disaster Declarations History

The Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, commonly referred to as “the Stafford Act”, defines a major disaster as “any natural catastrophe (including any hurricane, tornado, storm, high water, winddriven water, tidal wave, tsunami, earthquake, volcanic eruption, landslide, mudslide, snowstorm, or drought), or, regardless of cause, any fire, flood, or explosion, in any part of the United States, which in the determination of the President
