Comprehensive Plan Evaluation Amendments Section 163.3191, Florida Statutes

- □ Evaluation of comprehensive plans once every seven years;
- □ Determine if amendments are necessary to reflect changes in state requirements; and
- Failure to transmit evaluation amendments results in not being able to amend comprehensive plan.





Future Land Use Element

- □ Discourage the proliferation of urban sprawl;
- □ Electrical distribution substation; and
- □ Update statutory references and dates.









Transportation Element

- Change name from Traffic Circulation Element to Transportation Element;
- Update roadway segments based upon those established by Florida Department of Transportation;
- Provide a means to assess a proportionate share cost of providing transportation facilities necessary to serve proposed development; and
- □ Added Transportation Planning Best Practices.











Housing Element

- □ Add extremely-low income to the types of affordable housing provided; and
- □ Remove outdated statutory references and dates.









Sanitary Sewer, Solid Waste Drainage, Potable Water, Natural Groundwater Recharge Element

- Ensure adequate water supplies and facilities will be in place and available no later than the issuance of a certificate of occupancy; and
- Remove outdated statutory reference and dates.









Conservation Element

□ Update Strategic Regional Policy Plan date.

Recreation & Open Space Element

□ None needed.

Intergovernmental Coordination Element

- □ Update and insert reference to state agencies; and
- □ Remove policies that pre-date the Public Education Facilities interlocal agreement.





<u>Capital Improvement Element</u>

- Remove outdated statutory reference and dates;
- □ Five-Year Schedule of Improvements; and
- □ Concurrency Management System.

Public School Facilities Element

- □ Updated statutory reference
- □ Updated Planned Public Schools Maps





- □ Regulate extraction activities to prevent adverse affects on the quality of:
 - □ Air;
 - □ Groundwater;
 - □ Surface water;
 - □ Land; and
 - □ Wildlife.





- □ Comprehensive Natural Resource Protection
 - □ Identification of mining and excavation district;
 - □ Restriction in conservation areas;
 - Avoidance, minimization, and mitigation of adverse impacts; and
 - □ Restoration of function of natural systems.





- Requires land development regulations address mining, land excavation, filling activities, reclamation and reuse;
- Requires mining activities be consistent with land development regulations;





- Requires land development regulations provide permit requirements and standards for:
 - □ Site Location;
 - □ Site Design;
 - Environmental Protection; and
 - □ Reclamation.





- As part of the permitting process, potential groundwater impacts to be evaluated by applicant prior to commencement of mining activities;
- Water quality and quantity monitoring activities at extraction sites by County shall be paid for by applicant.





- Extraction operations shall use specific mitigation criteria to minimize adverse impact on:
 - □ Air;
 - Noise; and
 - □ Traffic.





- Buffer zones for extraction operations adjacent to:
 - □ Natural streams;
 - Watercourse;
 - □ Existing parks; and
 - □ Preserves.





- Mining activities shall not be initiated in:
 - □ Established residential areas; and
 - Designated conservation areas identified on the Future Land Use Map.
- Operating mine vicinity:
 - New residential development shall be restricted;
 or
 - □ Provide for adequate buffers and noise abatement.





Areas containing sources of commercially valuable minerals shall be protected from encroachment of incompatible land uses.





Summary

- □ Evaluation Amendments reflect statutory changes;
- Comprehensive Plan cannot be amended until Evaluation Amendments are transmitted;
- Mining text amendment regulate extraction activities to protect quality of air, groundwater, surface water, land and wildlife.
