Preparations for the 2020 Songwriting Contest are well underway. And as with everything else that is group related, the Coronavirus pandemic has affected plans, and will continue to affect decisions until the end of the contest.

Submissions are coming in at the same rate as 2019, and again, like last year, the deadline has been extended.

Location: In what most or all of the committee members consider to be a venue breakthrough, JSQ learned that the Turner Center Art Park the The Turner Center for the Arts in Valdosta was available for the songwriting contest. Turner Center staff have been most helpful. The Art Park was made to accommodate events like this. Social distancing is easily possible.

Virus: Pre-eminent in planning, since March, has been consideration of the pandemic. At this point, the large Art Park is amply spacious enough to allow for ten foot social distancing between family groups. However, if infection rates continue to rise, the contest can continue, but on-line, with judges and contestants only at the physical location.

Sponsors: the number of major sponsors is lower than this point in 2019. However, The Georgia Beer Company has signed on to be the lead. For a single event, it is likely the Songwriting Contest is one of the best promoted activities this group

does, producing a huge amount of goodwill for WWALS Watershed Coalition and Suwannee Riverkeeper. This year, with the virus economic slowdown, help in locating more sponsorships is needed from board and committee members.

One thing is sure, while on-going plans may continue to change as needed for the 2020 event due to the virus, the discovery of The Turner Center Art Park is significant and will be a plus for future Songwriting Contests.

Banks Lake is in the middle of long awaited pier remodel: this along with more time to plan may help increase decorated boats.
