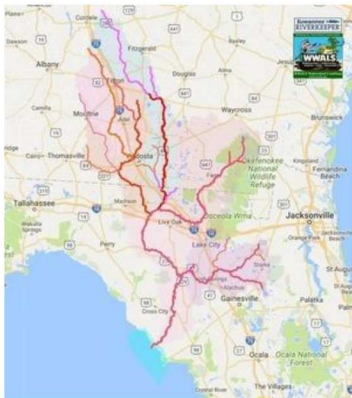

We acknowledge that this is a reimbursement grant, that it requires a 20% cash match, and that the grant term is one year from the date of the grant agreement, by which time the project must be completed. In addition to the cash match, we will provide volunteer hours designing, preparing, and distributing cards and signs, planting signs at the water, holding educational events (paddle outings, cleanups, webinars, etc.). The cards and signs contain URLs and QRcodes leading people to our more extensive online educational materials, with text, tables, pictures, and interactive maps: <http://wwals.net/water-trails/> These online materials list, describe, and often picture numerous points of interest such as relics or sites of old bridges (rail and road) and fords, obstacles such as deadfalls or power lines, beaches, waterfalls, geology, plants, and animals.
