	<p>Mr. Still also mentioned abundance of sediment in the Sampson Canal and trusts the USDA grant will help to alleviate this matter.</p> <p>Mr. Still also mentioned the canal connecting Lake Hampton to Santa Fe is obstruction primarily from vegetation. Director Shuford suggested the possibility of FWC's interest in clearing the vegetative debris.</p> <p>Director Shuford praised Mr. Still for his interest and concerns and in being instrumental in the County being awarded the Sampson River and Alligator Creek Flood Abatement Grant.</p> <p>Mary Lou Hildreth commented the maintenance of culverts in the City of Hampton are a concern as well. Her attempt to apply for any grants to mitigate this issue have failed due to lack of city historical records but will continue to pursue other possible grant alternatives.</p> <p><b>Review of Project List:</b></p> <p><b>#1. New EMS Station in Theressa...</b> EMS Director Allen Parrish commented that he is exploring several options in coordination with County Fire Department and Keystone Airpark and hoping to a definitive answer and direction this coming year. One specific part of the new station is to have 24/7 living quarters. For this past 18 months EMS has been leasing a personal residence to house EMS personnel on the south-end of the County and will continue to do so until new station is built.</p> <p><b>#2. Build new EOC...</b> No comments. Item to remain on project list.</p> <p><b>#3. Request SRWMD watershed study...</b> Mary Lou Hildreth noted there are several flood prone areas in Hampton and feels administration should push harder with Suwannee River Water Management District to address these issues. Director Shuford also suggested reaching out to Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) on some of the flood prone areas and what will become of 3-pipes once flood abatement project is complete.</p>	<p>Director Shuford to contact FWC.</p>
