Please find attached a letter WWALS sent Friday July 8th 2016 to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) with two new reasons for the Corps to open a Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS) about the proposed Sabal Trail pipeline and for FERC to cease issuing permits for it.

The two reasons are a new hydrogeological report by Peter J. Schreuder P.G., commissioned by Bobby C. Billie and Shannon Larsen, from whom you have already received a copy, and an unlisted pipe yard north of Lake City in Columbia County, of which WWALS has already informed SRWMD.

This is in addition to the previous geological report by Dennis J. Price P.G., of which you are aware.

Mr. Valenstein saw personally at Suwannee River State Park many sinkholes where Sabal Trail proposes to cross the Suwannee River, and he heard from Chris Mericle and Dennis Price about issues concerning Sabal Trail crossing the Falmouth Cathedral Cave System. As you are aware, Sabal Trail does not have all the state or federal permits it needs, since the Georgia legislature has denied it river-drilling easements, neither Georgia nor Alabama has issued Clean Water Act Section 401 permits, and USACE has not issued any permits, nor has FERC given Sabal Trail permission to proceed with construction.

I ask SRWMD to defer any easements for Sabal Trail until after USACE opens and performs a Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS). Perhaps you could also ask USACE to open a SEIS.
